Heb. 1:7 is also figurative. It is again judgment at the 2nd advent. (Note: "again" vs. 6) I would also place 2 Thes. 1:8 in the same group.

HEBREWS 1 CT

6 But at-the-time-that again he-might-lead-in the firstborn into the inhabited-earth, he-is-saying: And let all angels of-God worship him.

7 And on-the-one-hand toward the angels he-is-saying: The *one* making his angels spirits, and his public-ministers a flame of-fire;

II THESSALONIANS 1 CT

7 And relaxation with us to-YOU the *ones* being oppressed, in the uncovering of-the Lord Jesus from heaven with messengers of-his power,

8 In fire of-flame, giving an-avenging to-the ones not knowing God absolutely and to-the ones not obeying the good-news of-our Lord Jesus,

The only two uses of the verb are in a <u>figurative sense</u>. (See Apologetics 3, pp. 15, 16) (Apologetics 17)

JAMES 3 CT

6 And the tongue is a fire, the world of-the unrighteousness, the tongue is-being-established among our members, namely-the-one spotting the total body and setting-aflame the course of-the genesis and being-set-aflame by the Gehenna.

The 3 passages in Revelation are all figurative, "his eyes as a flame of fire." These passages indicate judgment. (See Rev. 1:15, 16, Rev. 2:20, 23, Rev. 19:11, 14).

In the use of the noun in Luke 16:24 the word "fire" does not occur.

LUKE 16 CT

24 And having-hollered he himself-said, Father Abraham, you-have-mercy-on me, and you-send Lazarus, in-order-that he-might-dip the tip of-his finger of-water, and he-might-cool-down my tongue; because <u>I-am-being-pained</u> in this flame.

APOLOGETICS 39

This use seems, not only figurative as the others; but lack of the word "fire" seems to indicate other than a Divine Judgment.

ACTS 7 CT

30 And when forty years were having-been-fulfilled an angel was-seen by-him in the wilderness of-the mountain Sinai in a-flame of-fire of-a-bramble-bush.

In Acts 7:30 the flame of fire did not consume the bush (Ex. 3:2)
